# Parent/Guardian/Spectator Code of Behaviour

Cowra Netball Association (CNA) is committed to providing a safe, positive, and supportive environment for all players, officials, and spectators. As a parent, guardian, or spectator, your actions and words play a vital role in shaping the culture of our sport.

By attending games, training sessions, or events, you agree to uphold the following Code of Behaviour:

#### 1. Respect for All

- Treat all players, coaches, umpires, officials, and other spectators with respect at all times.
- Accept that umpires' decisions are final. Disputes or concerns must be raised through the proper CNA channels, not during games.
- Refrain from yelling, intimidating, or harassing any participant, including opposition players and officials.

### 2. Positive Support

- Encourage good sportsmanship by applauding effort, fair play, and improvement not just winning.
- Provide positive reinforcement to your child and their team, focusing on fun, fitness, and development.
- Avoid giving instructions from the sideline; allow the coach to coach and the umpires to officiate.

### 3. Zero Tolerance for Abuse or Misconduct

- Verbal abuse, swearing, bullying, or aggressive behaviour towards any person will not be tolerated.
- Alcohol, drugs, or being under the influence while attending games or training is strictly prohibited.
- Any act of violence or threatening behaviour will result in immediate removal from the venue and may lead
  to further disciplinary action, including suspension or banning.

#### 4. Setting a Positive Example

- Remember that children learn by example demonstrate respect, patience, and good sportsmanship at all times.
- Promote a culture where participation and fun are valued above results.
- Be mindful that your behaviour reflects on your child, their team, and the association.

5. Breaches of the Code

CNA takes breaches of this code seriously. If a parent, guardian, or spectator fails to comply:

- A verbal warning may be issued by an official or committee member.
- If behaviour continues, the person may be asked to leave the venue immediately.
- Serious or repeated breaches will be escalated to the CNA Committee, which may impose penalties such as:
  - Written warnings
  - Temporary or permanent bans from attending matches
  - Reporting to higher governing bodies such as Netball NSW
